

Unbroken (Part 1): The Covenant God Never Canceled

SERMON OUTLINE

Introduction:

- Israel is not a side issue — it's a central thread running through the heart of our faith.
- When you tug on the thread of Israel, you pull every thread — history, theology, justice, the very return of Jesus.
- When we understand Israel rightly, we understand the heart of God more clearly — His faithfulness, His promises, and His plans.

What is Replacement Theology?

- Definition: *Replacement Theology teaches that the Church has replaced Israel in God's plan.*
- Teaching Moment: "But if you study Scripture carefully, you see something different — you see that God's promises to Israel are everlasting, not temporary. God doesn't replace His promises. He fulfills them!"

Why We Must Challenge Replacement Theology

1. **God's Covenant with Israel is Everlasting**
 - a. Genesis 17:7–8; Jeremiah 31:35–36
2. **God Has Not Rejected Israel**
 - a. Romans 11:1–2
 - b. God's choosing is not based on their perfection — it's based on His covenant love.
3. **Israel Has a Role in End-Times Prophecy**
 - a. Ezekiel 37; Zechariah 12–14
 - b. Israel's survival and role in end-time prophecy is one of the greatest proofs of God's faithfulness in history.
4. **Gentiles Are Grafted In, Not Replacing**
 - a. Romans 11:17–18, 24; Ephesians 3:6
 - b. We are not the tree. We are branches grafted into the tree. God didn't uproot Israel; He extended His mercy to us alongside them.

Conclusion:

- God has not abandoned Israel. And as believers, we are called to honor God's covenant promises.
